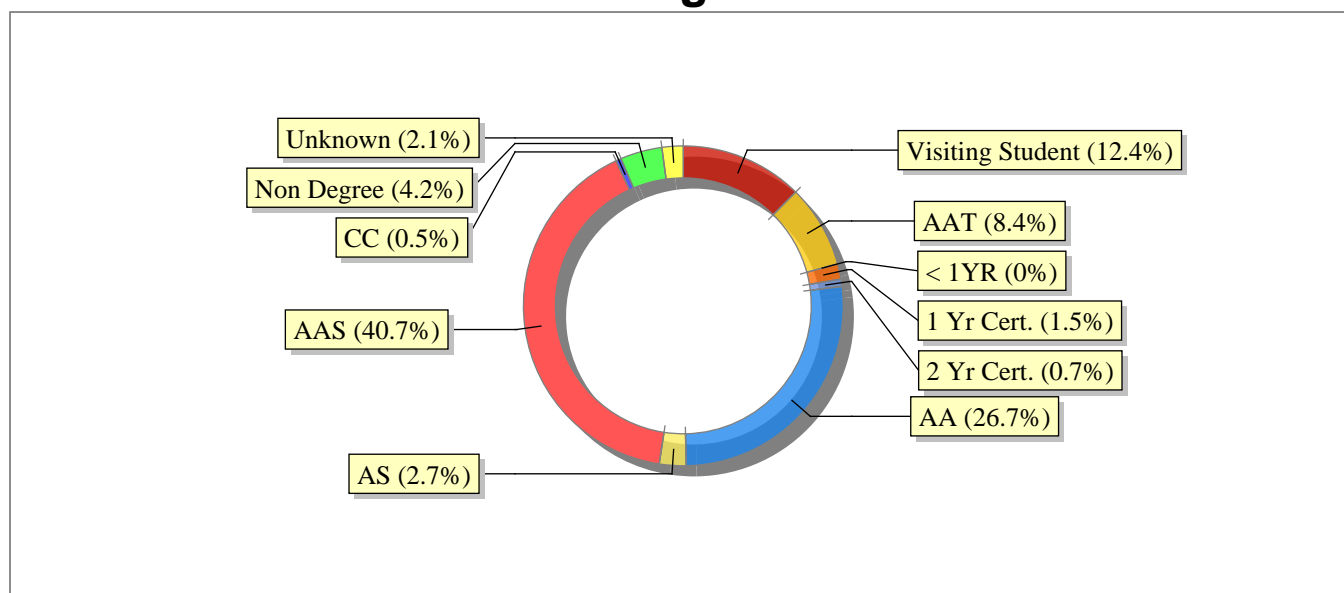

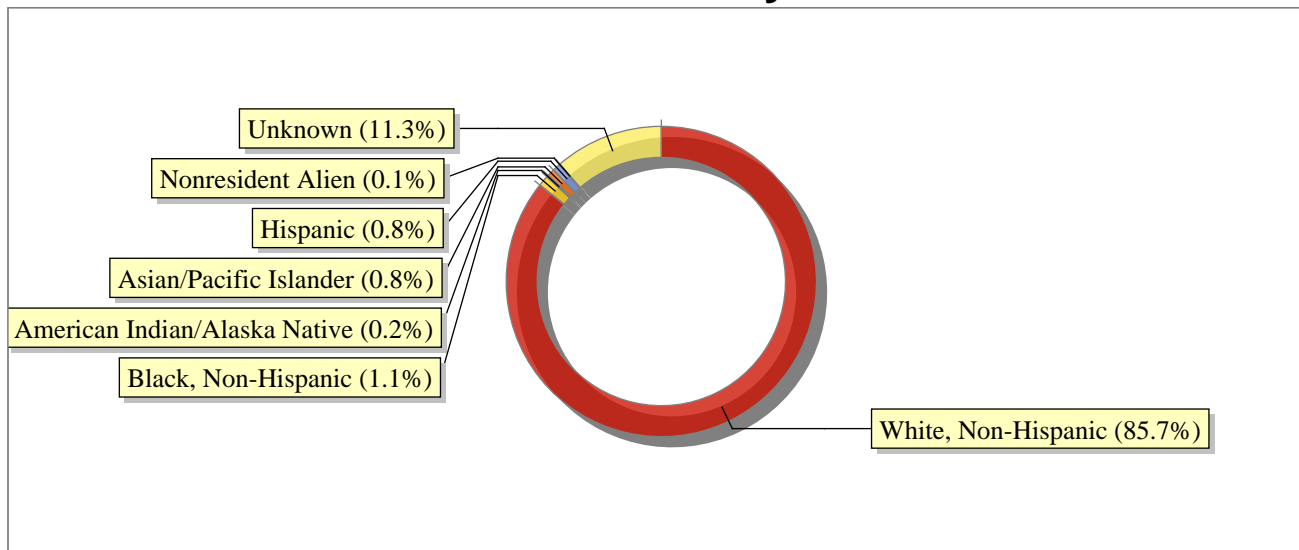

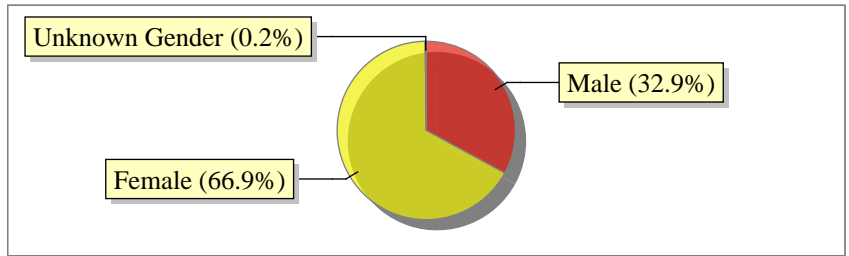

#### % Gender



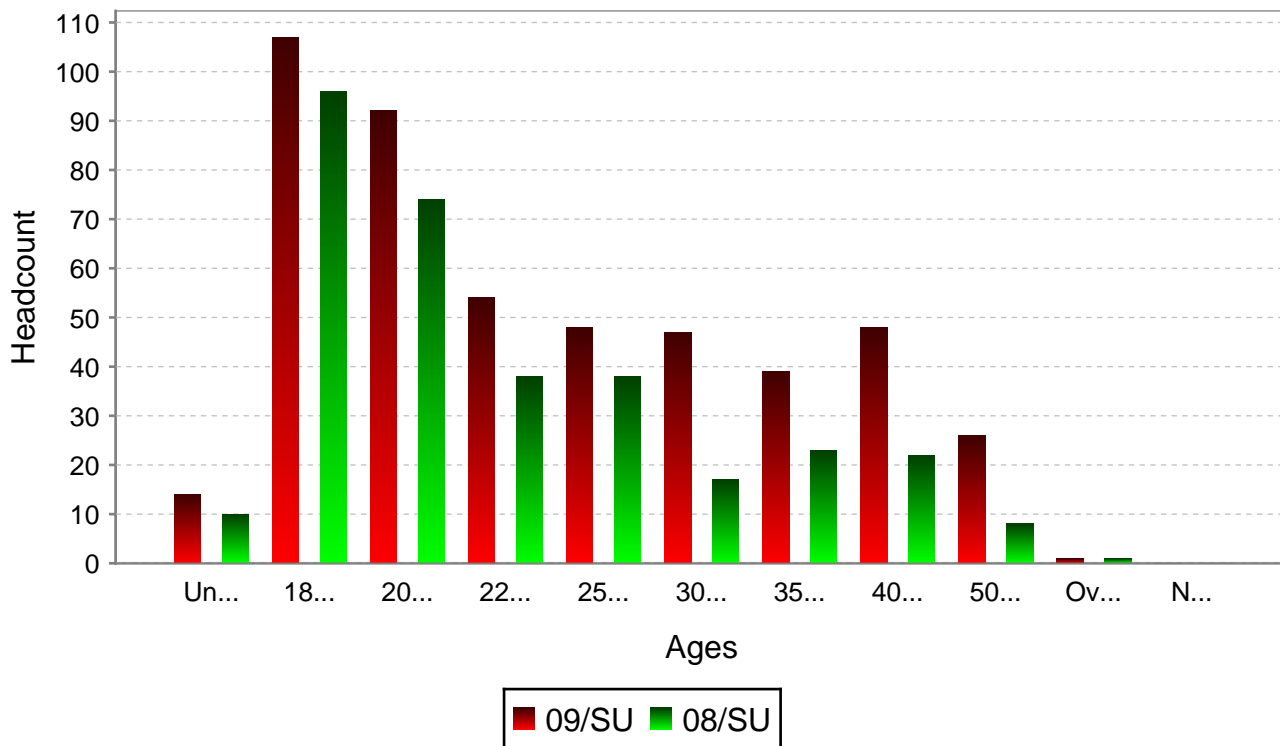

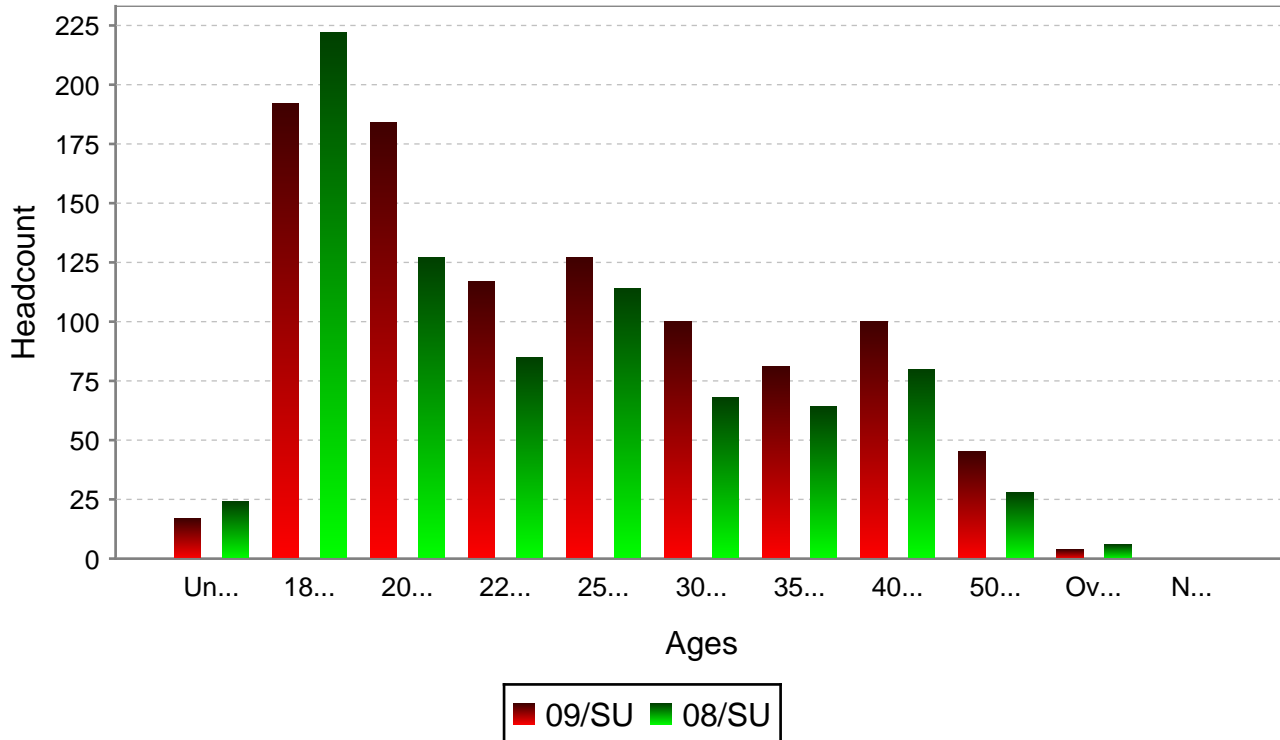
