Better Writing with One Click

The Learning Center began an exciting new service last semester that allows students to receive writing help from any computer with an internet connection, any time. Students use Moodle to submit papers which are reviewed by a Learning Center Writing Specialist. The Specialist then returns the commented paper via Moodle. Papers are usually returned to the student within twenty-four hours!

“This is a great service for our busy students, many of whom juggle full-time work, school, relationships, and family responsibilities,” said Tim Derifield, the Online Writing Center coordinator. “These time-constrained students are able to get writing help while on the go.”

Dulce Hernandez-Rojas has used the OWC this semester and found it a great help: “I had other homework to do and got tutoring help while other things were going on. Tutors provided links to information that helped me with my grammar.”

Students can begin using the Online Writing Center by logging in to Moodle and looking for the “ECC Online Writing Center” link on the left-hand side of the page or by visiting the OWC webpage at <http://www.eastcentral.edu/learning-center/online-writing-center>. For those students who are more comfortable meeting face to face, The Learning Center still of-

fers traditional tutoring available by appointment or walk-in.

The agreement between Pearson and ECC allows the Testing Center to proctor hundreds of industry-standard tests and certifications including Cisco, CompTIA, and the Missouri Gateway Entrance Assessment.

Pearson Vue tests are computer based, allowing one center to give many different exams at the same time as well as provide easy and quick retrieval of scores.

In addition to the new suite of Pearson Vue exams, the Testing Center continues to offer CLEP, Accuplacer, proctored distance-education exams, and exams for East Central College classes by instructor request. Six Tips for Success in Online Courses

Whether you are trying to improve a grade in a current class or looking forward to an online course next semester, now is a good time to make sure you are on the right track. Figuring out online classes can be tricky, so here are some tips to help you reach your academic goals:

Learn your instructor’s communication policy.

Most teachers outline this in their syllabi. Some teachers will get back to you within 48 hours, others may vary.

Have a back-up plan for what you will do if you don’t have access to your computer or internet. If you wait until you have problems, you might miss important assignments.

Read all directions carefully. Email your instructor if anything is unclear before the assignment is due. Communicate before you are frustrated and angry.

Schedule “class time” for yourself every week. Alt-

hough you won’t be driving to class, it’s best to schedule blocks of time each week for your classwork. It is easy to put off online coursework. Don’t fall into that trap.

Open a Word document to write. For essay questions, forum posts, and papers, do not compose in the text boxes provided. Check for errors. Then, copy and paste your answer in the text box provided.
