





Why is HLC Accreditation Important to us?

- East Central College must be fully accredited by the HLC to receive Title IV funding. Approximately 75% of our students are eligible to receive Title IV aid.
- Accreditation by the HLC assures that credits earned at ECC will transfer and be accepted by other colleges and universities.



Tuition Waiver Benefits for Employees

East Central College Tuition Waiver Eligibility

- Full-time employees up to six credit hours per semester
- Part-time employees up to six credit hours per semester
- Adjunct instructors up to six credit hours during the semester immediately following completion of assignment
- Retirees Eligible for up to six credit hours per semester
- Spouses of full-time employees up to eighteen credit hours per semester
- Unemancipated children of full-time employees up to eighteen credit hours per semester.



Tuition Waiver Benefits for Employees

Central Methodist University Tuition Waiver

- Full-time ECC employees and members of the immediate family may receive certain waivers of tuition and/or fees for classes taken at Central Methodist University on the East Central College campus in Union, MO or online.
- Undergraduate courses 100% Tuition waiver for ECC employee, spouse and child dependent.
- Graduate courses 100% tuition waiver for ECC employee, 50% for spouse and no waiver for child dependent. The tuition waiver also includes graduate program courses for ECC full-time employees and spouses.



Tuition Reimbursement Benefits for Employees

East Central College Tuition Reimbursement Eligibility

- Educational assistance benefits are provided to full-time employees.
- Course must be taken at a regionally accredited college or university and must be applied toward a higher degree than the current highest degree of the employee or a recognized post-secondary certificate or non-degree credential.
- Degree related coursework will be reimbursed in accordance with Board Policy up to an amount equal to 100% of the applicable undergraduate or graduate educational fee (tuition) at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.
- Employee tuition reimbursement covers tuition only and does not apply toward any special fees or book/supply costs.
