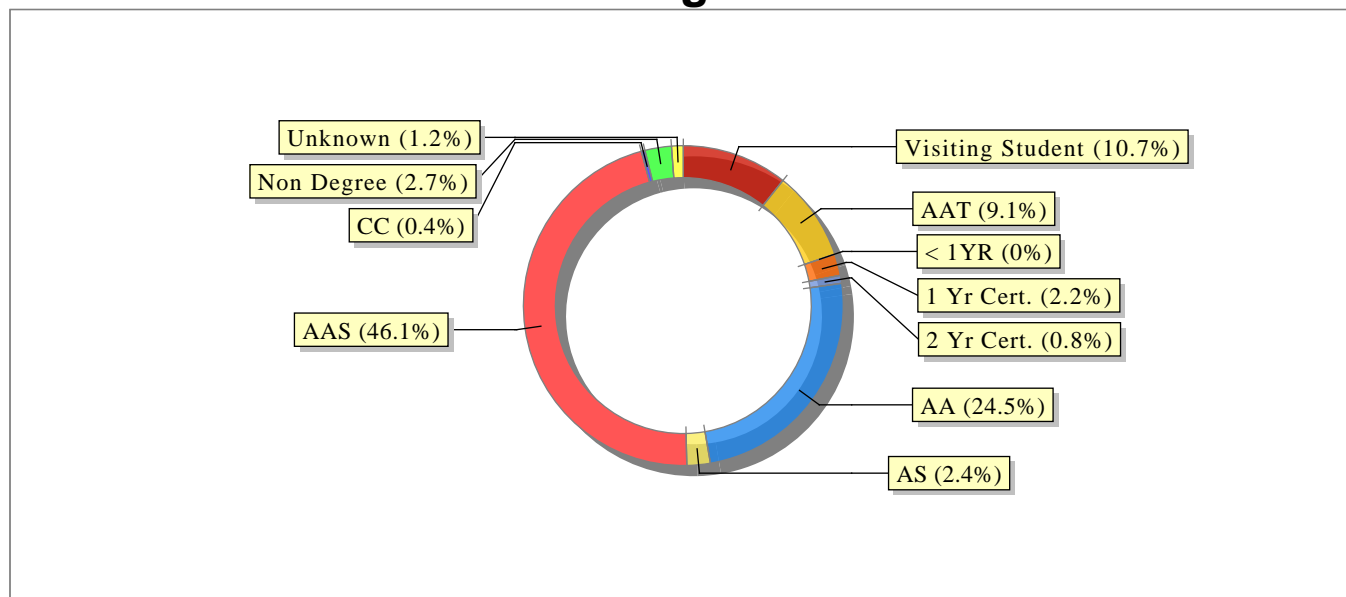

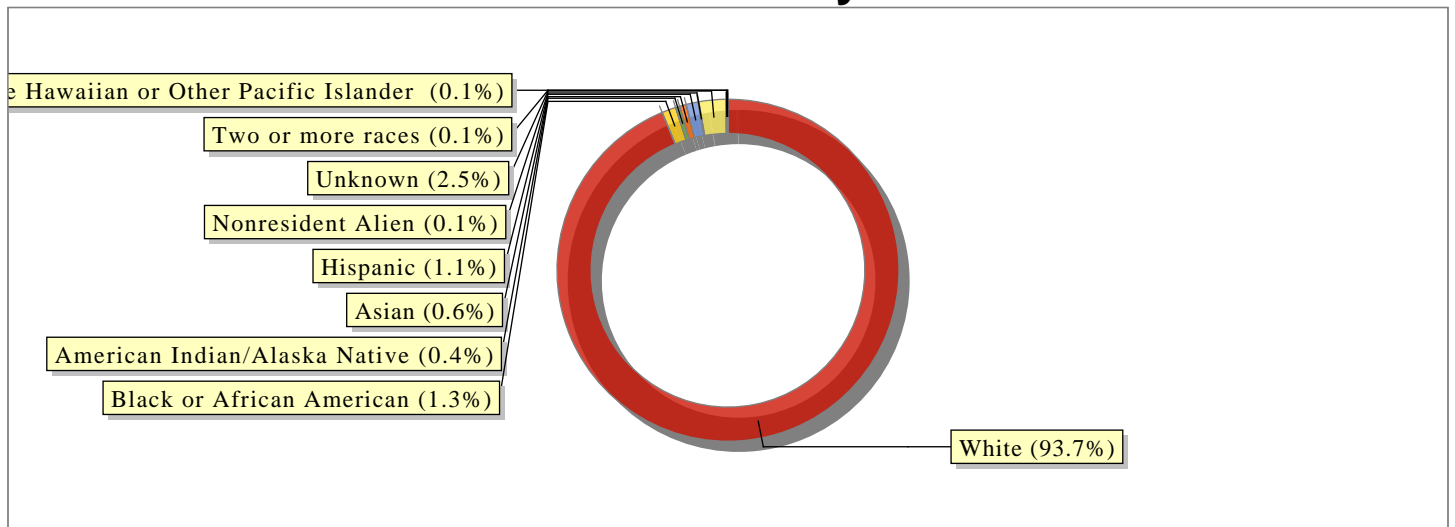

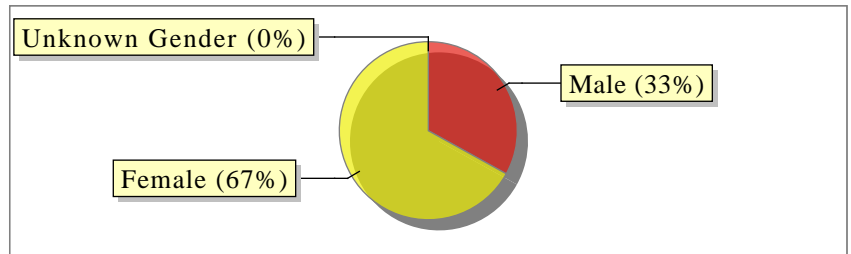

#### % Gender



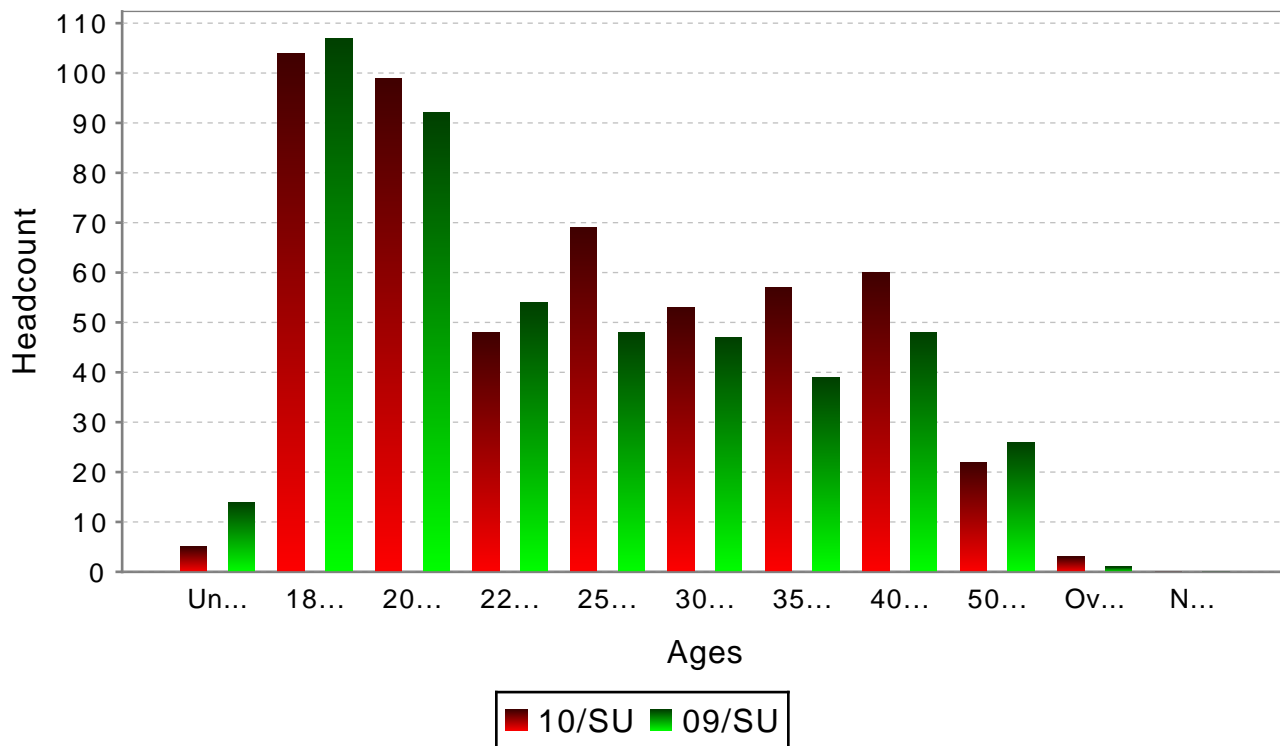

#### Male Ages



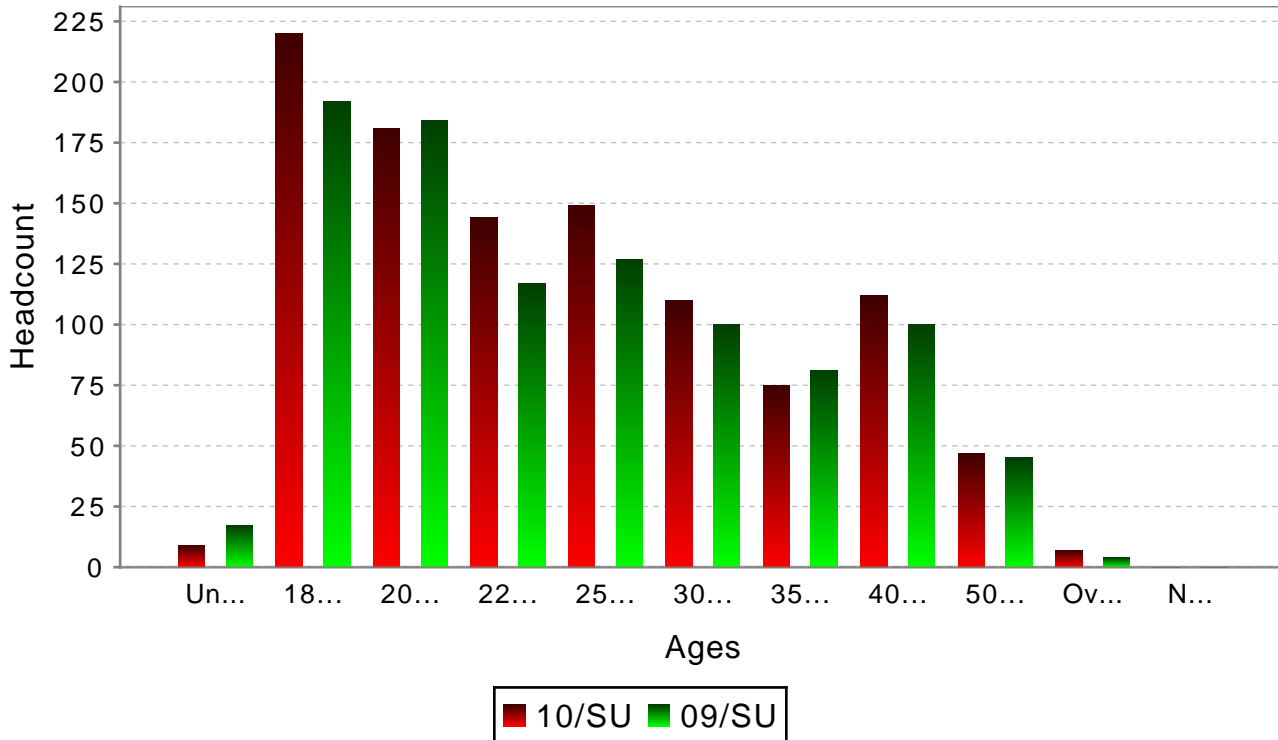
