PROGRAM

The East Central College Medical Assistant degree program is designed to train competent professionals to meet the needs of an ever-expanding allied health field. It combines both formal education and practical experience to help participants master the complex body of knowledge and specialized skills necessary for a successful career.

The program, offered in Rolla and Union, prepares competent, entry-level medical assistants in cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills) and affective (behavior) learning domains. The program offers a certification and an AAS degree option.



CAREER

Medical assistants are multi-skilled professionals specifically educated to work in ambulatory settings performing administrative and clinical duties. Specific tasks include phone support, bookkeeping, coordinating appointments, personally interacting with patients, coding paper and electronic health files and completing insurance forms. Some medical assistants also take patient vital signs and help with injections, examinations and lab test preparations under a doctor's supervision.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To enter the program, students must have completed:

- High school diploma or the equivalent (documentation must be sent to the registration office)
- A placement test as specified by the college (please note: some coursework requires minimum placement results)
- Minimum college GPA 2.0
- Externship placement is contingent upon a successful drug screen and criminal background check
- Students with a prior criminal history should contact the Health Science office prior to registering for Medical Assisting courses.



The AAS degree is designed for students seeking employment immediately upon graduation. However, many of the credits, particularly the general education electives received with this degree, may qualify as transfer credit by four-year schools.

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EMPLOYMENT & SALARY OPPORTUNITIES

By 2026, the number of medical assistant positions across the country is expected to increase by 32.4 percent, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. In 2017, the annual average pay for these professionals was \$31,370. Jobs for medical assistants in healthcare organizations include:
