This Guide is intended for the use of students who plan on transferring from East Central College (ECC) with a completed Associate of Arts in Teaching to the University of Missouri – St. Louis (UMSL) to pursue a Teacher Education degree with Certification to teach in the state of Missouri.

### Degree Options

## 6. Teacher Education Requirements

All Teacher Education students must meet the following requirements to enter the Junior-level of their UMSL degree program:

- A Cumulative College GPA of 2.75 or higher
- An Education GPA of 3.0 or higher
- A Content Area (Middle School and Secondary) GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Complete the Missouri Educator Profile (MEP)
- Achieve a score of 220 or higher on the following five sections of the MoGEA, Missouri General Education Assessment:
  - English
  - Mathematics
  - Science
  - Social Studies
  - Writing
- Students must also be able to pass the *Family Care Safety Registry* background check and a TB Test to enter the UMSL Teacher Education Program.
