# THE IMPACT YOU COULD HAVE

### **Improve Poverty Rates**

75% of Americans who receive food stamps perform at the lowest 2 levels of literacy, and 90% of high school dropouts are on welfare.

### **Lower Healthcare Costs**

Nearly half of American adults have difficulty understanding and using health information. Lack of understanding impedes adults' abilities to make appropriate health decisions and increases the chance of incurring higher health costs.

### **Lower Prison Recidivism**

75% of state prison inmates did not complete high school or low literate. Inmates who are educated are 43% less likely to return to prison.

### **Improve Employment**

Individuals at the lowest literacy and numeracy levels have a higher rate of unemployment and earn lower wages than the national average. Low literacy costs the U.S. at least \$225 billion each year in non-productivity.
